4	Defused IED	Recovered from person, unclaimed bag or place	Label or Tag on outside the container	Whole IED may be sent.	Should be packed with cloth.	The IED should be diffused properly and diffused Certificate should be sent to FSL with the IED
5	Grenades	Recovered from person, unclaimed bag or place	Label or Tag on outside the container	Whole Grenade with fuse removed.	Should be packed with cloth tightly inside the packing box so that it does not jerk.	Live Grenades are not received in the FSL.
6	Time Device	Recovered from person, unclaimed bag, place or removed from IED	Label or Tag on outside the container.	Whole device.	Should be packed with cloth or paper.	If battery is connected it should be sent with the device.
7	Fuse wire	Recovered from person, unclaimed bag, place or removed from IED.	Label or Tag on outside the container.	1 or 2 feet of the long wire.	Should be packed with paper.	If detonator is connected, it should be removed and send it in separate packet.
8	Soil or debris	Recovered from explosion site	Label or Tag outside the polythene cover.	Maximum 500g.	Should be packed in polythene bags.	Top layer of crater caused by the explosion should be collected and sent to the FSL
9	Metallic balls, splinters, stripes, rails, broken cycle, motor parts etc.	Recovered from explosion site	Label or Tag outside the polythene cover.	2 or 3 parts where damage is maximum.	Should be packed in polythene bags.	The exhibits where explosive deposits is supposed to be maximum should be sent.
10	Grenade splinters	Recovered from explosion site	Label or Tag outside the polythene cover.	5 or 6 pieces maximum.	Should be packed in polythene bags.
